## Amateur Radio Operators Emergency Preparedness Plan

Radio amateurs should exemplify preparedness. Only when you and your family are safe can you serve your community and country. Taking a little time to plan for your family's safety can minimize injury, death or suffering. How prepared are you?

Most important in disaster preparation is to HAVE A PLAN! Radio amateurs must plan not only from the amateur radio perspective, but also with respect to community and family. You should presume loss of AC power and amateur radio repeaters, as often happens after storms.
